


# Skilling and Livelihood Promotion

Through this initiative, the programme strives to eradicate poverty and promote socio-economic empowerment among underserved groups in society. Our well-equipped centres deliver quality, reliable, and sustainable infrastructure, ensuring economic development with an emphasis on affordable and equitable access for all. Collaborations with government organizations, non-profits, and corporate CSR wings have been instrumental in benefiting our students and amplifying the positive impact of our efforts. The programme's alignment with the SDGs underscores its commitment to create a more inclusive and equitable future for all.


Currently, this programme is operational in five states across India – Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Maharashtra, Uttarakhand & Tamil Nadu.

#### **Background and Need**

The programme emphasizes on education and skill development of children and youth in rural India under the "Skill India Mission" by Government of India. It comprises various courses such as, Spoken English, Basic Computer & Tally, Cutting and Tailoring, and Beauty & Wellness.

#### **Objective**

The objective of the programme is to enhance the economic growth and improve employability that will decrease poverty. Empowering the underprivileged sections socioeconomically by achieving economic growth, eliminating social difficulties, and promoting economic inclusion are some of the outcomes of the programme. Aakarshan programme focuses on making the people of rural and semi-urban India ready for job and empowered by offering various skill development courses and assisting them with employment.

#### **Computer and Tally**


The skill development journey of Aakarshan programme began with a 6-month Computer and a 4-month Tally courses. This was the first course taught in Kuleshra, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh in 2013, which is a semi-urban area having migrant residents from Uttar Pradesh and Bihar. The course is a blend of basic computer training and softwares that drives employment and skill upgradation for students. We provide advanced computer training, in a holistic manner in classrooms to stretch the learner's abilities to the fullest.

Software courses like Tally are taught in collaboration with NIIT Foundation. It covers Tally Fundamentals, Manual Accounting, Computerized Accounting, Cost Centre, Cost Category, Inventory, GST, and TDS. Along with the variety, we assure them quality training under our courses. Successful learners also get reputed certificates from Tally which helps them to get employment.


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#### Number of Learners in Computer and Tally

#### **Cutting and Tailoring**






#### Number of Learners in Cutting and Tailoring











#### Number of Learners in Beauty and Wellness

To cater to the needs of a highly migratory and predominantly unskilled population hailing from diverse regions of Bihar and Uttar Pradesh, our strategically designed programme was implemented in the Kulesera village of Gautam Budh Nagar District. The project's primary objective was to extend support to the youth and women residing in Kulesera and its neighboring villages. This was achieved through well-structured skill training courses, including Computer and Tally, Spoken English, Cutting and Tailoring and Beauty and Wellness in Greater Noida.

In partnership with Shahi Exports, we introduced the Industrial Cutting and Tailoring Course in 2017, specifically targeting the shortage of skilled labor in India's thriving textile export industry. This course has proved instrumental in empowering aspiring women as they receive intensive industrial trade's training spanning 45 days. Following the training period, students are offered valuable On-the-Job training and employment opportunities at Shahi Exports and other renowned textile industries. This exemplary initiative serves as a testament to the positive impact of skill development in empowering women and promoting their economic independence.

In the FY 2022-23, Aakarshan Skill Development Programme in Greater Noida trained 575 students, bringing the total number of students trained at the Centre to 3,362 till date.



SMF Aakarshan Programme embarked on its journey in Uttarakhand in 2014, starting with the establishment of the first skill development centre at Balika Vidya Mandir Junior High School in Jagatpura, Pantnagar. In 2015, the second skill development centre opened its doors in Rudrapur, Uttarakhand. These centres were established with the aim of providing resources and support to children residing in slum areas. The first centre focuses on offering Basic Computer and Spoken English training in collaboration with the government school, catering to lesser privileged children and youth. The second centre, on the other hand, provides training in Basic Computer, Spoken English, Cutting and Tailoring, as well as Beauty and Wellness.

In the FY 2022-23, 663 learners successfully graduated from Aakarshan Skill Development Centre in Uttarakhand, reaching a total of 4,017 individuals till date across both centres.


#### **Beauty and Wellness**

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
### Impact <sup>|</sup>



The Aakarshan Programme set its foot in Maharashtra in 2014, starting with Donde Village in Pune. Initially offering a Computer course, SMF has now expanded its offerings to include additional courses like Tally, Spoken English, and Beauty and Wellness, all under one roof.

In the FY 2019-20, SMF further expanded centre to Rajgurunagar, Khed Block, Pune, introducing training in Cutting and Tailoring. This region is predominantly inhabited by tribal communities who have limited access to skill development programmes. SMF's research revealed that they had to travel approximately 20 km to access such types of trainings. Recognizing the immense potential among the youth and women, SMF aimed to provide new opportunities through its courses.

In the FY 2022-23, Aakarshan Skill Development Centre in Maharashtra reached to 378 students, imparting skills to a total number of 2,571 learners till date.



# Dual Systems of Training



This project was started to establish link between Industry and Industrial Training Institutions. SMF has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the DTTE Government of NCT of Delhi for the Dual System of Training Course. This curriculum can help to bridge the gap between academics and machine learning. The programme began with ITI, Arab Ki Sarai, Nizamuddin in the trade of Press Tools, Jigs, and Fittings. Wadhwani Foundation is our official programme partner, and they impart Soft Skill modules to our participants.

# World on Wheels Project

HP has developed and deployed 48 self-contained, Internetenabled digital inclusion and learning labs in rural India. This project, known as HP World on Wheels (WoW), is a part of initiative named People-Planet-Profit model to advance digital literacy, e-education, entrepreneurship training, and other citizen services

In recognition with HP, MDMCT, BSG and NIIT foundation, SMF presents the "World of Wheels- WoW bus" at Hasanpur village in Gurugram, Haryana.

This bus possessed 20 computers, a printer, a 65-inch touch screen and functioned as a whiteboard and a display sound system just to make it a mobile digital laboratory.

Not only this, the solar panel of the bus roof was running entirely on solar energy. The theme of it was to promote online learning for students. As the bus was containing learning materials for classes 1 to 12, the bus serves as a "Common Service Centre (CSC)."

The project was initialized at Hasanpur village on January 7, 2021. The strength of those six batches since then was always around 76. The class includes Tally GST and a special batch for women for the sake of their computer literacy.

The initiative has held several awareness workshops with 334 students till now.

# Minda Mitra -Motorcycle Mechanic Training Project

Spark Minda Foundation started a first-of-its-kind programme in the automobile component business with the opening of its cutting-edge living Garage named "Minda Mitra".

On July 12, 2019, Minda Mitra was created on the premises is of the company's Noida facility. This facility is similar to a live garage, with cutting-edge live demo units, two-wheeler current flow models, and workbenches for practical teaching and theoretical lectures. This garage is equipped to handle a wide range of repairs and maintenance due to its in-house expertise.

# Minda Mitra's major goals are as follows:

► To improve service and quality by educating and updating internal and external stakeholders'



technical abilities and grasp of current workshop mechanics,

- Identifying applicants, who are excited about a new career opportunity and certifying them as technical experts,
- New product development and field trial validation.

Minda Mitra's "Ustad" initiative aims to enhance, empower, and equip local youths with job-related skills. It focuses on training young mechanics by delivering Technical Skill Training during a three-month course to assist them in launching their careers. It also assists trained technicians, who are unable to find work in a recognized workshop.





# **Business Integrated Prison Project**

Poverty, migration, childhood abuse, neglect, and a lack of opportunity are all factors contributing to an increase in crime and deviancy in society. The movement is built on the notion that justice, at its foundation, is based on reformative action, and it aims to reduce crime in society by giving offenders second chance. Through this approach, there is a need to readuce socioeconomic divergence by imparting skills and providing economic possibilities to inmates.

As part of this effort, inmates are instructed in the skills required to work in the automobile industry, and production facilities are set up within the grounds and among the prisoners in accordance with state law.

This programme, based on the notion of a Public-Private Partnership, is unique in India's automotive sector. The automotive manufacturing factory is built within the prison grounds as part of this effort to educate and employ inmates. This scheme has given offenders the opportunity to get occupations within the prison and support their families from within the prison through money generating.

Through this initiative, around 150 prison inmates have been reached till now.

# Saksham – Empowerment of People with Disabilities


### Introduction

In 2014, Spark Minda Group launched a programme "Saksham" to ensure sustainability in the lives of People with Disabilities (PwDs) by giving a holistic approach. The programme has reached to more than 16,500 PwDs till date and will continue to reach more in the coming years.

In addition to provide assistive aids and fitments for PwDs, "Saksham" has helped many PwDs to get their first job, provided them with their livelihood, and facilitated skill development and sustenance.

It augments the Accessible India Campaign (Sugamya Bharat Abhiyan) of the Ministry of Social Justice and Welfare, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities. It has made key policy-level interventions in the field of Health, Skill Development, and Employment generation for People with Disabilities. The project supplements Section 135, Schedule 7 of the Companies Act 2013 and is in line with the Sustainable Development Goals, SDG 1 - No poverty, SDG 3 - Good health and wellbeing, SDG 10 - Reduced Inequalities, full and productive employment allowing PwDs to access the job market. SDG emphasizes the social, economic, and political inclusion of PwDs, SDG 11 - creating an accessible and sustainable transport system, providing access to safe, inclusive accessible public spaces, and SDG 17 - underlines the importance of partnerships and collaborations of likeminded organizations, non-governmental and corporates alike.

Since its inception, under this programme, SMG has employed more than 1,000 PwDs. This programme is a unique example of like-minded collaboration with the government, non-governmental organizations, trade associations, private organizations, and academia. Minda Corporation is also a member of the reputable India Business Disability Network (IBDN), an initiative of Confederation of Indian Industry (CII).





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### **Empowerment of People with Disabilities Camp**

Spark Minda Group's endeavour is that every person in the country is treated fairly and is empowered. Empowerment camps are organised every year at different locations with the aim to reach PwDs by providing free of cost accessible and assistive aids, facilitating UDID registration, and providing employment opportunities and skill training. The aim is to build an inclusive and harmonious society. We want people to believe that it is not the disability that counts but the abilities that they have matter.

This year SMF conducted four camps in Uttarakhand, Jammu and Kashmir, and in Uttar Pradesh and benefitted more than 3500 people with disabilities through accessible and assistive aids, UDID, and employment.

### **Process of the camp**

Team carried out the need assessment exercise after getting in touch with various Governmental Bodies, stakeholders, and CSR fraternities, by organizing screening camps and came to know about the PwDs adjacent to the areas.

#### The methodology followed:

- a) Involvement of Government (District Administration) in the identification of PwDs for the programme.
- b) Association with mobilizing partners/stakeholders (NGOs and Panchayat).
- c) Organizing screening camps in identified areas for selecting PwDs.
- d) Employment of PwDs across units of Spark Minda Group.

e) Bringing ergonomic upgradation for employment of PwDs.

### **Registration desk**

The registration desk was set up at the entrance of the camps to track the total number of PwDs attending the camp. Medical assistance was provided to the PwDs for the identification of Fitment types and Assistive aids they require. Pre and post-fitment records are maintained through Photography of the PwDs.

# UDID- Unique ID for People with Disabilities

A UDID assistance desk was set up to offer assistance to PwDs for UDID registration; PwDs were counseled and made aware of the benefits of the UDID card. Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DPwD) support was also extended during the registrations of PwDs.

## Spark Minda Foundation (SMF) in collaboration with Pratham Shwaas Foundation, Dehradun 14th to 16th May, 2022

An empowerment of PwDs camp was organized at Dehradun for three days from 14th May to 16th May, 2022 in collaboration with Pratham Shwaas Foundation.

Through this camp we reached to 138 PwDs with 188 fitments.









## Spark Minda Foundation (SMF) in collaboration with the Indian Army, Jammu and Kashmir 22nd to 27th August, 2022

The Saksham programme has been designed to help People with Disabilities to reduce their dependence on others for mobility and earning a living. The camp was conducted from August 22nd to 27th, with an aim to help those needy locals in Kupwara, Jammu and Kashmir, who do not have the financial means to get an artificial limb, assistive aid & hearing aid.

Artificial limbs, wheelchairs, hearing aids, axillary crutches, walkers, elbow crutches, and hand sticks were distributed to the needy during the camp. We reached to more than 403 people from adjoining areas through fitments and UDID card registrations.



### Spark Minda Foundation (SMF) in collaboration with Rotary Club, Noida 3rd and 4th December, 2022

Commemorating the International Day of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs), SMF as part of one of its initiatives, Saksham, commenced a two-day Camp for Empowerment of PwDs in collaboration with Rotary Club, Noida. The camp witnessed huge participation of PwDs from different areas of Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Haryana, Uttarakhand, and Bihar among others. The employees of the Spark Minda group volunteered during the camp. The team was able to help PwDs with assistive aids - artificial limbs, calipers, crutches, walkers, and sticks - which were provided on the spot, befitting their requirements. A special prosthetic hand from LN4 was also provided to the PwDs. Around 117 fitments, along with 19 UDID registrations were provided.



# 4. Mega Camp for Empowerment of People with Disabilities, Noida, Uttar Pradesh 1st to 10th February 2023

The camp was organized for 10 days in Noida with the collaboration of many partners. Along with the registration, UDID, and employment desk, there was an addition of the Entrepreneurship desk in the camp as well. To widen the reach to PwDs, eye checkup, and spectacles distribution was also organized. Through this camp, we reached to 2,864 PwDs by providing them with assistive aids, UDID registrations and employment.

### **Employment**

An employment desk was set up to facilitate the employment of PwDs across the Spark Minda Group as well as external agencies and organizations. HR volunteers from group factories volunteered and counseled the PwDs for potential employment opportunities. Companies like Amazon and Big Basket also participated in the employment desk.

### Entrepreneurship

The Project "Keys on Wheels" is for the empowerment of People with Disabilities (PwDs). In collaboration with IIT Bombay and Minda Silca Engineering Private Limited (MSEPL), a customized tricycle was introduced in the camp. This prototype model holds potential possibilities for entrepreneurship. The special prototype of the tricycle "as it is designed by IIT Bombay" has a very ergonomic design and is efficient.

Minda Silca Engineering Private Limited is a global brand of reference for the production of keys. For the Swavalamban project, MSEPL provides :

- Training via workshops
- Machines
- ▶ Keys & consumables (Raw material)
- After sale services
- Technical assistance
- ▶ Guidance on legal aspects of business

This is an "ON THE GO", Economical locksmithing entrepreneurial opportunity and will provide people with livelihood, mobility, and self-sufficiency. Many PwDs came forward to express interest and provided feedback.

### Eye Camp

Eye camp was also set up in collaboration with Vision Spring Foundation to ensure the eye health of the people. People who attend the camp received a free eye examination and the attendees received free eyeglasses too.

### **Hearing aid**

Hearing aids were provided to the PwDs attending the camp. This helped to widen the scope of Saksham and reach out to PwDs with hearing impairment. This has provided extensive happiness in the lives of 638 people with hearing impairment.

### Driving through the imparities



Shabir Ahmad is a 30-year-old from the town of Gurez in the Bandipora district of Jammu and Kashmir. He used to love driving, and it was also his source of income. In December of 2021, he was diagnosed with a blockage in his nerve, and the doctor advised him to have his leg amputated. This was devastating news for Shabir, as he was now unable to drive and support his family. There were also limited resources available for rehabilitation in his town. He had been dependent on his brother for help. He was made aware of a camp organised by Spark Minda Foundation in collaboration with the Indian Army in Kupwara. Shabir was hopeful that he would be able to get a new leg that would allow him to drive again. He travelled to the camp, which was approximately 130 kilometres from his home. He was fitted with a prosthetic limb. After the fitment and gait training, he was able to drive his car around the camp. He was overjoyed to be able to drive again and thanked SMF and the Indian Army for giving him a new lease on life.









### I am different, but not less

Madiya, a 13-year-old girl from Handwara in Jammu and Kashmir, has been a fighter from birth. Diagnosed with cerebral palsy and hearing impairments, she faced delayed developmental milestones. Her inability to stand, walk, or communicate marked her early life, compounded by limited medical access due to living in a remote region. Affording a hearing aid was tough for her family, yet they clung to hope, knowing Madiya's resilience. Learning about a Camp for Empowerment of People with Disabilities by Spark Minda Foundation in collaboration with the Indian Army, they eagerly attended. There, Madiya received her first hearing aid, hearing her parents' voices with newfound joy. A fighter who has overcome many obstacles, she aspires to become a lawyer through sheer determination. Spark Minda Foundation is proud to support Madiya's journey and wishes her immense success ahead.

Jishwant, an 11-year-old brave child from New Delhi, is in the 5th standard. His family comprises five members. Being the eldest son, he aspires to support his family economically in the future. During his free time, he enjoys playing games. His father works as a construction mason, and their economic situation makes medical expenses a challenge. Nervousness transformed into joy as the calipers made walking easier. Progressing towards his police officer dream, this experience enhanced his determination and dedication. The miracle child





Bhavik is an absolute gem. He is five years old and is from Delhi. He is an innocent child who likes to play and watch cartoons. During his birth, due to the complications faced by his mother, he lost sensation in his legs. His parents are facing issues and are struggling to pay for his treatment. He is admitted to a play school so that he can enjoy himself with other friends his age. They have always wanted him to be happy and enjoy his life. His father is a rickshaw driver, and once he was passing through the road when he saw the Saksham - Camp for

Empowerment of People with Disabilities banner. He made up his mind at that time that he wanted to take his son to the camp so that he could get support from the SMF team. After getting his son consulted by the doctors of SMF, Bhavik was provided with calipers and was so excited throughout the process of fitting the Caliper. - Employment and Entrepreneurship Facilitation in and outside the Group.

### **Pune Centre**

The Pune centre was established in March, 2018 and caters to more than 10 blocks of Pune, over 4 districts of Maharashtra and is open for People with Disabilities across neighbouring states of India.

### Unbreakable spirit

Yamuna, a 26-year-old woman from Latur, Maharashtra, embraced a new phase of life after her recent marriage. Unfortunately, a bike accident altered her path, leading to the amputation of both legs below the knee. With a financially limited background, Yamuna's family sought options to support her recovery. Learning of the Saksham-Empowerment of People with Disabilities Centre, they visited, and Yamuna received her first prosthetic limbs. Gait training followed, and within days, she confidently walked with a near-normal pattern, radiating a commendable smile. This marked the first time Yamuna stood on her own legs since the accident three years ago. This newfound physical independence brought forth mental strength, alleviating fears of public outings and resuming normal activities. Today, she manages household chores and takes walks with her husband. Her journey reflects her determination, and we take pride in being part of her inspiring story.





### Journey of hope and resilience

Prem Anil Vavle, a 14-year-old from Parbhani, Maharashtra, shines as a bright and promising teenager with a passion for sports. Tragedy struck when he met with an accident that resulted in the amputation of his left leg below the knee. This incident was a devastating blow to Prem, and adapting to his new life proved challenging. The loss of school attendance and sports participation led to isolation and loneliness. However, a turning point emerged when Prem's family learned about the Saksham - Empowerment of People with Disabilities Centre. Eagerly, they took him there, where he was provided with his first below-knee prosthesis. Remarkably, he swiftly adapted to the gait pattern, achieving independent walking within days. This achievement boosted his morale significantly, and his newfound joy radiated with a million-dollar smile as he returned home. The Noida Centre was established in 2021 to serve the people of the peripheral states in northern India. It caters to approximately 6 districts of Uttar Pradesh and more than 3 states and is open for PwDs across the country.



#### The courageous child

Danish Khan, a three-year-old boy from Delhi, has encountered numerous challenges in his brief life. Starting at the age of two, he began experiencing seizures, developed a stutter while speaking, and had his left leg twisted, impeding his walking. His parents, a bike technician and a homemaker, strive to afford his treatment. Determined to provide Danish with a normal life, they were elated upon discovering the Saksham-Empowerment of People with Disabilities Centre. After visiting the centre, Danish received a customised ankle-foot orthosis, enhancing his stability and confidence in walking. Now, he actively engages with friends and activities at his preschool. Danish's parents are grateful for his progress and take pride in their son's journey.









#### A true dreamer

Omkar Singh, a determined 24-year-old from Bulandshahr, worked at a hospital for four years and was supporting his family, including his father, mother, two brothers, and two sisters. Despite his father's income, who works as a labourer, he shouldered family expenses and his siblings' education. Tragically, he met with a road accident, which led to his hand amputation. Unable to afford treatment, his life crumbled. After learning about the Saksham – Empowerment of People with Disabilities Centre, he was fitted with an artificial hand, rejuvenating his outlook. With this newfound ability, Omkar now sustains his family and pursues his aspiration to be a pharmacist. He has enrolled himself in a pharmacy course. His vision extends to owning a medical store in the future. His journey is a testament to resilience, and we are proud to have helped him.

#### SKILLING AND ⊢ EMPLOYMENT

Skilling and employment are the main pillars in ensuring the sustenance of lives. With the proper skill-set and training one can achieve his/her goals. A person can only be truly empowered when he/she can sustain his/her life, without having to depend on anyone else.


Thus to ensure sustenance in the lives of PwDs, Saksham programme also assists with the employment needs. The Group has employed more than 1,000 PwDs in Spark Minda Group (SMG). For implementing this, collaborations with NGOs working for the employment of PwDs are established. With these partnerships, we can either source

the manpower from these organizations or access the information from the database. This database is collected during camps and at the Empowerment of PwDs Centre. Organizations such as National Association for Blind, Youth 4 Jobs, Samarthanam, Sarthak Educational Trust, and many others have been of assistance in helping the PwDs. The PwDs absorbed by the factories are given OJT (On-Job-Training) in order to accomplish the designated task. Thus imparting skills and knowledge for their growth. Along with the training for the job, we also provide them with safety training to save themselves during emergencies or mishaps.


#### Journey of inspiration

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## Health and Wellbeing

#### Introduction

With a population of more than 1.5 billion people, India is the second most populous nation in the world and is continually growing. As a developing country, we continue to struggle with a rapidly growing population and unequal access to resources for wellbeing. The promotion of health and wellbeing is of the utmost importance for individuals and societies alike. In rural India, various factors influence the overall wellbeing of people such as menstrual hygiene, family planning, eye health, and blood donation. The emphasis is on urgent action to maintain the health of people and the environment and ensure holistic development of all.

In line with Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), SDG 3: Good Health & Wellbeing; SDG 5 - Gender Equality; SDG 6 -Clean Water & Sanitation; SDG 17 - Partnerships for the Goals, we must prioritize equal access to health administrations in our development strategies. Addressing these vital aspects of healthcare is essential for the holistic development and empowerment of women, as well as the overall improvement of public health in the country.

Spark Minda Foundation has adopted a comprehensive approach involving education, awareness campaigns, medical camps, and community engagement. By partnering with governmental organizations, non-profit entities, healthcare providers, and local communities, Spark Minda is taking significant steps in improving menstrual hygiene, family planning, eye health, and blood donation practices.

Spark Minda Foundation started Health and Wellbeing initiatives in the five distinct Indian states of Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, and Haryana. Through these initiatives and best practices, we aim to pave the way for a healthier, empowered, and inclusive society.





### SHAKTI Strengthening Menstrual Hygiene Management

#### **Background and Need**

It is alarming to know that globally, at least 500 million women and girls lack proper access to menstrual hygiene facilities (World Bank; May 12, 2022) There are several factors that contribute to the difficult experiences that women and girls have with menstruation, including inadequate facilities and materials, menstrual pain, fear of disclosure, and insufficient knowledge about the menstrual cycle. It is crucial to address this issue as it plays an important role in the empowerment and overall wellbeing of women and girls worldwide. Menstrual hygiene extends far beyond mere access to sanitary pads and appropriate toilets; it encompasses creating an environment that values and supports women and girls menstrual health rights, enabling them to manage their menstruation with dignity.

Addressing menstrual hygiene effectively contributes to the empowerment and wellbeing of women and girls across the country. Menstrual hygiene is also providing comprehensive support and resources, we can enable them to overcome the challenges associated with menstruation, allowing them to lead their lives with confidence, dignity and good health.

#### **Objective**

- To educate society on menstrual hygiene management and family planning.
- ► To improve access to menstrual products and facilities.
- ► To create awareness of modern family planning methods amongst men and women and about the prevalence of Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs).
- ► To promote the health of children by allowing sufficient time between pregnancies.
- ► To protect and promote the health and wellbeing of women by educating them about high-risk pregnancies and menstrual practices.

#### **Process**

Under Shakti programme, Spark Minda Foundation consistently works to empower women and girls in line with the United Nations "Every Woman, Every Child" initiative. It is a humanitarian effort that focuses on enhancing the lives of women in vulnerable areas in Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Uttarakhand, Haryana, and Tamil Nadu by enhancing their health and hygiene, family planning, and awareness of reproductive health. Through this initiative, we organised several camps in Indian communities and prisons of Haryana to improve awareness of family planning and menstrual hygiene.

#### 1. Shakti in Prisons

Shakti in Prisons started in collaboration with Spark Minda Foundation and India Vision Foundation in 16 prisons of Haryana. 16 prisons in Haryana are participating in the collaborative project "Shakti in Prisons" between India Vision Foundation and the Spark Minda Foundation. In line with the SDGs and UNICEF's global WASH programme, this initiative aims to encourage women inmates to practice good menstrual hygiene, so that they can easily access resources.

This provides additional assistance in enhancing the ecosystem for educating women inmates on the What, Why, and How of menstruation and good hygiene and sanitation practices.

Seven hundred women inmates from 16 Haryana prisons were covered under this initiative during FY 2021–22. Around 12 in-person training sessions were conducted, followed by four online training sessions to raise awareness. The goal is to instill the values of hygiene and safe practices in female

inmates as well as to introduce them to menstrual hygiene management methods.

#### 2. Shakti in Community

#### (i) Menstrual Hygiene

Shakti in the community is the way to improve the health and hygiene of women by making them aware of various health aspects related to menstruation and family planning. This initiative is carried out with the assistance of community members, including Asha and Aanganwadi workers in partnership with local organization.

#### This initiative is carried out in 2 Phases

**Phase I:** The first phase of the initiative focuses on conducting sessions to create a fundamental understanding of how the female body functions, how it transitions from the child stage to puberty, a biological understanding of menstruation, taboos and myths associated with it, and discussions about community-specific understanding is done in detail to bring out the rationale of menstruation.


**Phase II:** In the second phase, we aim to give women the fundamental knowledge they need to manage their periods with the aid of menstrual products. In order to generate a sustainable source of income, instruction on how to make sanitary napkins is also given.

### (ii) Family Planning and Reproductive Health

Family planning is pivotal as it focuses on reducing pregnancy complications. India, the second-most populous country,

began a family welfare programme that is connected with populous country reproduction and child health in order to reduce the population rate. It also emphasises on minimising teen pregnancies, reducing infant mortality rates, lowering the danger of sexually transmitted infections, and most significantly, empowering and educating people. The goal of this programme is to advance a thorough understanding of good family planning and reproductive health. Counselling, education, access to contraception, and safe abortion are all part of the family planning services. To supplement the family welfare initiative of the government, Spark Minda Foundation organises awareness sessions across 4 states of India i.e Uttarakhand, Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh and Tamil Nadu.

#### Outcome

The Menstrual Hygiene initiative under the Shakti programme has successfully addressed the issues of Menstrual Hygiene and has helped women to become aware of healthy practices. This initiative has helped 4,110 women in community and prison to understand menstruation and debunk myths around it. Women have access to hygiene products and are able to make them as well. Family Planning enables individuals and families to make informed decisions about their reproductive health. Access to contraceptives, comprehensive sexual education, and counselling services plays a vital role in empowering couples to plan their families, improve maternal and child health, and alleviate the burden on healthcare systems. By promoting family planning initiatives, we aim towards healthier families, reduce maternal and infant mortality rates, and promote economic stability.

















## Eye Health Care

#### **Background and Need**

India is home to one-fifth of the world's visually impaired people, with an estimated 12 million people suffering from blindness. However, the majority of these cases are preventable or treatable with timely interventions. The need for eye health care in India is immense, owing to several factors such as poverty, lack of awareness, inadequate healthcare infrastructure, and inadequate access to eye care services. The burden of eye diseases is particularly high among the rural and low-income populations, who often lack access to basic eye care services.

#### **Objective**

The primary objective of an eye camp in rural areas is to provide basic eye care services to people living in remote areas, where access to eye care is limited or non-existent. The aim is to detect and treat eye diseases and conditions at an early stage, prevent blindness and improve overall eye health in underserved communities.

#### Reach

To address the need for Eye Health Care, Spark Minda Foundation organises annual Eye Health Care Camps, in


collabration with partners such as, Health Age India and Vision Spring in rural and semi- urban location covering five major states i.e., Haryana, Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Uttarakhand.

This is more-so laidback in rural areas with the underprivileged population. Seeking consultation only when utmost needed, is something that needs to change. In bringing about this change in the villages that Spark Minda Foundation caters to; the most common reason for neglect was the lack of accessibility. Catering to this need and following the sustainable development goals in regard to health, we are providing healthcare services to those who can't avail it due to unawareness, lack of accessibility, and cost-effectiveness. We reach out to people at the ground level and support them.

#### Outcome

In the financial year 2022-23, around 6,014 people were benefited from our Eye Health Care Camps conducted in the villages of Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Haryana, Tamil Nadu and Uttarakhand. During these camps, we cater to the rural population in and around the respective villages, provide corrective eyewear and diagnose eye problems.

Since 2016, the foundation has provided the communities it serves with eye healthcare services. We have covered 24,756 residents from these camps till date.

## Community Health Check-up

#### **Background and Need**

Every person has the right to healthcare, but in India, 60% of the population lacks access due to poor infrastructure, lack of skilled medical professionals, and lack of basic medications and services. The majority of the 700 million people reside in rural areas, where medical services are in appalling condition. Given the bleak image painted by the statistics, new techniques and processes are desperately needed to guarantee that timely and high-quality healthcare reaches the underserved areas of Indian communities. In rural India, where there are few Primary Health Care centres (PHCs), 8% of the facilities lack medical staff or doctors, 39% lack lab technicians, and 18% lack even a building. Nonetheless, more than 50% of the populace still lacks access to basic healthcare services.

#### **Objective**

Healthcare for individuals and communities must be timely and efficient in order to be considered holistic. Spark Minda Foundation hosts various medical camps in the neighbourhood around its production regions to determine the community's most basic medical needs to promote health-related awareness and offer vital services.

#### **Process**

General physicians, gynecologists, pediatricians, orthopaedists, and dentists work together at the medical camps to offer primary healthcare examinations and services to the underprivileged community. Mobilization for these camps were conducted with the help of collaboration.

#### Reach

These camps were organised in the community situated near the project offices covering Tamil Nadu, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana and Maharashtra.

#### Collaboration

These camps were organized in collaboration with local hospitals, Spark Minda Group medical team and the Gram Panchayat.

#### Outcome

Till Financial Year 2022-23, around 9,075 people were covered through these camps.





















## **Blood** Donation Drives

#### **Background and Need**

There is a well-known saying: "The gift of blood is the gift of life. There is no substitute for human blood. Blood cannot be manufactured – it can only come from generous donors". Blood donation camps are essential in India to address the shortage of blood and meet the demand for blood during emergencies. These camps also promote voluntary blood donation and raise awareness about importance of the same.

#### **Objective**

Since blood is irreplaceable, it is the duty of every healthy individual to donate blood and save a life. Spark Minda has been supplementing this by organising Blood Donation Drives since 2014. Spark Minda, intervenes through its CSR campaigns to bridge the blood requirement gap by organizing blood donation camps in group factories involving the nearby community.

#### Process

For Blood donation, the employees are given awareness. Those who are interested in donating blood are listed. Once

the hemoglobin levels and the blood pressure is checked and report is normal, the blood is drawn and donated.

#### Collaboration


We work to close the gap between the supply and demand of blood units with the assistance of the local community, Gram Panchayat, Rotary Club, Red Cross, the National Thalassemia Society, and hospitals. Companies hold educational seminars about the value of blood donation and how it benefits society.

#### Reach

These camps were conducted in the periphery of the group companies, i.e. for Maharashtra, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Haryana.

#### Outcome

In FY 2022-23, around 1,089 units of blood were donated by employees of Spark Minda Group bringing the total donated since the programme's commencement to 8,014 units.


### Environment & Resource Protection




